New Literacy Approach for Piwakawaka pupils



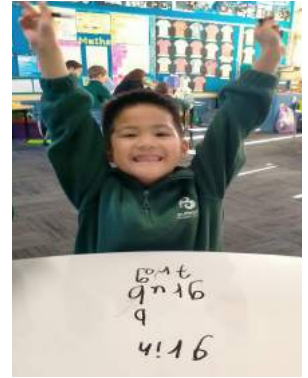

In Piwakawaka we have implemented a new literacy approach - Better Start Literacy Approach, from the University of Canterbury. The children take part in a shared story that is aimed to extend their vocabulary; the books are beautifully written by New Zealand authors with Māori kupu as well as rich English vocabulary. During their small group sessions students are learning their alphabet letter sounds and names, and practising their reading skills. We focus on segmenting and blending letters and sounds to make and write words, as seen in the photos below. We are so impressed with how confident our learners are at making words, as well as their speed! They are super proud of themselves, as are we!
